What if I told you we developed one of the most efficient, yet uncomplicated ways for you to defend yourself in real life street altercations one of the possible most vulnerable places for you and your Principal, whom mostly turn out to be life threatening situations? We totally understand if you are cynical on the mere sound of this, but please allow me a moment before judging this proclamation.

Yes, do I believe people might see this as absolutely irrational or even ridiculous especially in view with all the different self-defence methods and styles available out there. We do not claim to be superior to any other authority or style, and appreciate the fact that there are some exceptionally experience and skill full instructors teaching what they believe is most



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relevant. The reason we so strongly differ in our methodology to self-protection training is the mere fact that it is a method that has been developed over a long period of time (20 Years +) through a loss of lot of blood and first-hand experience and with the view point having competed within numerous different subjects and styles at a professional level the likes of boxing, wrestling, MMA and kick-boxing to name but a few.

Please read the following in order to feel a fair ruling:

Firstly apologies for the long explanation, however, to ensure transparency, and for potential students to grasp the concept we feel the need to be crystal clear.

The author and your CQS Lead instructor gained front-line experience within different war zones and undesirable settings over the past 25+ years. This gave him many years of practical STREET experience and has seen him shot (point blank 5 times), stabbed and seriously hurt by an IED (Improvised Explosive Device) hence the reason through first-hand experience he feels so strongly about the CQS (CLOSE QUARTER SURVIVAL) course.

REAL LIFE:

Steven Lochner has practical experience within the Armed Forces (Hostile environment deployment), police, special events, nightclub and late night entertainment venue protection, utilising trained protection dogs for hostile crowd control and has also served as active CPO for more than 20 years.

SPORT:

He accomplished in different sport combat disciplines and styles, achieving black belt, medals and titles in various different sport combat codes. He instructed in Mixed Martial Arts and one of his former students whom he introduced to MMA became the holder of 3 International rivalry belts. He is currently the only MMA trainer in Africa whose student fought a challenger who became UFC (The premier MMA body in the world) champion. Vale Tudo is the term for MMA used in Brazil (Where modern day MMA originate from). In 2001 he was selected to be the South-African representative to the IVC (International Vale Tudo Council) based in Brazil, with the purpose to develop the sport of MMA in South Africa. The sport combat is mentioned not to impress or show-boat but only since it played a huge part in the formation of the CQS concepts, interesting though is the fact that very view techniques of what was acquired for over a period of more than 20 years, is used within our CQS concept.

ORIGIN OF CQS:

'I started an establishment that provided specialised security work force to nightclubs and late night leisure venues and also focussed on special event security. In the beginning for the first 12 years did I work the events and venues myself as a rule. When I started **OK** I was particularly fit, functionally strong, and had an unwavering mind-set in the sense of no matter what the odds I will simply not give up or allowed to be beaten within a one on one street confrontation and prepared adequately. This mental attitude I believe is what saved my life manier a times. The sport combat technique that I practiced in at that moment and time, mostly focused on striking, and I soon realised after a few street disputes, that I need to equip myself in a wider range of unarmed fighting and skills. South Africa in its nature is a ferocious country. It is a challenging and ruthless country



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if you allow it to be. Be ready at all times that anything can happen anywhere at any moment. During the 80's it was a free for all, and situations at certain venues and special events often turned very ugly, very quickly and more times than other to be fatal.

I experienced soon enough that I needed to get my team street-ready as rapidly as possible. I was not content until I got the answer to my predicament. I needed to get my squad equipped for what could turn into a lethal and vicious situation, as quickly as human nature allow for it and fuelled by alcohol and class a drugs this could be within an instant, and it was utmost important for them to be as effective as human possibly. You can only try and imagine the sheer volume of time, effort, sweat, tears and volumes of blood loss this took to be at a place where I now believe through the years of experience I might have achieved it hence the reason for the CQS concept, it comes from the street and not from the ring or matt or cage. With my hope to achieve this I've embarked on a journey where if I have to tell all and be heartlessly honest very few people could ever conceivably believe me. It took many, years, many unhuman altercations, much training, a lot of near fatal misses, losing some best friends in battle, to reach a point where I now am pleased that I've learned some very valuable lessons about staying alive on some of the most violent and demanding streets in the world. It is this knowledge and lessons learned in this that forms the blue print and foundation of the CQS course and the exact reason I believe this is something very different, unique and niche.'

As law-abiding citizens, it is not common for us to fulfil the role of attacker. It is us that get ambushed and attacked. The two worst conditions to land up in after the initial attack on you, is dead or unconscious. This is what we want to prevent at all cost.

IN CQS WE FOCUS ON:

First learning how to avoid the dangerous situation altogether through planning and awareness.

Then what to do for the situation not to become physical, and also prevent 3 conditions, dead, unconscious, incapacitated to yourself, if you did not succeed in avoiding the situation altogether.

Then how to neutralise the threat physically before it becomes a fight, when the first two steps failed, and you are forced to do so. We do this by using any means at our disposal, justified by the situation. These may include firearms, knife, stick, unarmed combat, pepper spray etc... We shall always adhere to the principle of minimum force.

The CQS course acts as an introduction to the CQB course. We cannot teach you how to fight in a couple of days. What we can do is teach you a couple of useful ways on how to survive and stay alive, so you allow yourself and your Principal to go back to your loved ones. We also first have to learn how to survive (CQS) the initial attack, to have any chance of doing battle (CQB) after that. In CQB we deal with how to handle ourselves once it got past the CQS stage, and we are forced into a drawn out fight. The CQB is really an on-going, never ending affair.

CQS COURSE SUBJECTS AND DURATION:

Theory: (Modules 1-5, Duration 1day)

Module 1 - The right to protect yourselves (Moral right, legal right, the right to bear arms, statistics)



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Module 2 - Awareness (Home, Vehicle, Walk)

Module 3 - Home invasion RST Teams (Prevention, cure)

Module 4 - Fear/Adrenaline (What is it? How to deal with the effects)

Module 5 - Verbal Judo (Convince someone verbally not to fight)

PRACTICAL:

Module 6 - Close quarter tactical handgun application (Level 1 - 1 day, Level 2 - 1 day, Level 3 - 1 Day)

Including Drive on and relevant CP Close Quarter Tactical Shooting. For this part of the CQS course you will use 400 rounds a day ensuring you totally grasp and understand the importance of the CQS technique and blueprint.

Module 7 - Knives and improvised weapons (1 Day)

Module 8 - Stick and Pepper Spray (1 Day)

Module 9 - Unarmed combat skills (4 Days)

The object of the course is to first:

Teach you skills how to avoid trouble altogether.

Firstly we try our best to avoid trouble altogether through awareness and proper planning.

Outlay of the CQS course (Total 10 days)

If that failed, how to avoid getting into a physical confrontation, if at all possible.

Thirdly to enable you to be better equipped to protect yourselves physically, in the case you did not succeed in avoiding the physical confrontation.

This course teaches real life application, not sport combat application. We believe, if your training is not relevant to dealing with real life confrontations, the time you spent in training is time wasted.

CQS and CQB courses – He has been instructing operators in different fields of operation, in street-wise CQB (Close Quarter Battle) since 1992. He is also the author and instructor of the this very popular CQS (Close Quarter Survival) course highly placed by X-Taskforce members and instructors whom attended the course, so much so that they feel it should be part of the foundation of all their training.

Anything that was trained and then tested, that did not work under stress, in real life, was disregarded. As far as physical resistance is concerned, we concentrate on the weapons you can conceal and carry with you, as well as how to use improvised weapons, and everyday items. These weapons include handguns, knife and improvised weapons, pepper spray, stick and unarmed combat methods. We also deal with everyday household items that would most probably be around and available to you, to defend ourselves with, at the time of the attack taking place. After this course, you will never be unarmed again.



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In the handgun application course we concentrate on the radius of 7m–0m. This is the area where, according to statistics, 90% of armed attacks take place. We teach close quarter, tactical handgun application, not target shooting, there is a HUGE difference and this could only be appreciated and understood once you attend or experience CQS first hand.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

None, although a minimum of Level 1 or equivalent in English language and numeracy is recommended. Whilst no prior knowledge is required the course is extremely intense and so we recommend that careful consideration is given before applying to do this course.

ASSESSMENT METHODS:

Based on classroom assessment and extremely intense practical exercises, all sections and tests, physical and theory, of the course must be passed in order to obtain your SIA license, PSIRA and SASETTA qualifications.

- Vaccinations in date (Polio, Typhoid, Yellow Fever, Anti-Malarial)
- Dog Tags IF NEEDED (Any known Allergies Do you require Penicillin Injection if needed)
- Kit / Clothing: This is not set in stone and is down to preference: it's only some pointers.

You need to be smart and professional at all times while attending the course. Due to a lot of practical work you will be instructed by Tutors manner a days to wear more rugged/casual clothes in order to do practical work. This means while attending class doing theory you need to have a ready bag at your disposal ready for action 24/7!!!

These are just some of the items I would include within my ready bag but it is not compulsory, as long as you've got gear to do rugged practical work, you will be OK.

- Jacket Gore-Tex (Berghaus / 5.11 / Softie Sleeka)
- Fleece (Berghaus / North Face / Karrimor)
- 2x Pants/Trousers (5.11 Tactical / Blacks / Millets)
- 2x Shirts (5.11/ Blacks / Millets)
- T-Shirts various
- Boots/ Shoes (Merrell / Lowas / Meindl desert fox)
- Socks (Loop stitch / 1000 mile)
- Hats (Baseball Cap, Bush Hat, Thinsulate beanie)
- Gloves (Berghaus / sealskinz / Contact gloves)

The above points is only advise so please do not think this is set in stone, I've tried to highlight subjects of importance but I might have missed some valued points, hopefully not. If anything needs clarified please do not hesitate to contact me A.S.A.P.



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Note: Tailor clothing to suit environment and time of year (Hot / Cold Climates) July/August can get quite hot but sometimes just as cold in S.A so ensure you have enough light and comfortable clothes but one or two warm/hot items as well at your disposal.
